

# Practice ACT Essay Number TWO

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## **Immigration**

The story of the United States is a story of immigration. From the very first settlers to recent waves of people fleeing strife in their native countries, the US is populated with people (or their ancestors) who originally called somewhere else home. Yet almost as long as there has been a United States, there has been disagreement about who should be allowed to immigrate, and several recent events have once again brought this issue to the forefront of public consciousness. Overall, is immigration beneficial or detrimental to the United States? Do the advantages outweigh the disadvantages?

Read and carefully consider these perspectives. Each suggests a particular way of thinking about the impact of American immigration policies.

### **Perspective One**

# We are a nation of immigrants. With the exception of Native Americans, we (or our ancestors) are all immigrants to this country. It is hypocritical for us to deny others the same opportunity that we received by immigrating to this country. It is the obligation of our nation to welcome immigrants with open doors and open arms.

### **Perspective Two**

Immigrants are a potential resource to our nation, bringing a diversity of ideas, cultures, arts, and cuisines. Great thinkers and workers want to come to the USA, and foreigners at risk in their countries deserve asylum in ours. We should allow immigration if the immigrants can demonstrate that they will be contributors to (and not burdens on) our society.

### Perspective Three

Among those immigrating into this country are terrorists, drug dealers, rapists, and murderers. Immigrants take our jobs, driving up unemployment. Those who can't get jobs are forced to steal or sell drugs to survive, increasing crime. For the safety of ourselves and our children and the greater good of our nation, we must close our borders and deny further immigration.
